

#### ΚΡΗΤΗ – 100 ΧΡΟΝΙΑ ΑΠΟ ΤΗΝ ΕΝΩΣΗ ΜΕ ΤΗΝ ΕΛΛΑΔΑ

Η μεγαλόνησος Κρήτη ήταν πάντοτε άρρηκτα συνδεδεμένη με το ελληνικό έθνος και τις ιστορικές του περιπέτειες. Στρατηγικά τοποθετημένη μεταξύ Ευρώπης, Ασίας και Αφρικής, γνώρισε πολλούς κατακτητές, από τους Ρωμαίους και τους Σαρακηνούς μέχρι τους Ενετούς και τους Οθωμανούς. Η ένωσή της με την Ελλάδα επιτεύχθηκε μετά από αιματηρούς αγώνες, με χαρακτηριστικό παράδειγμα τη μεγάλη επανάσταση του 1866, που σφραγίστηκε με το ολοκαύτωμα της Μονής Αρκαδίου. Μετά την επανάσταση του 1897-98 το νησί ανακηρύχθηκε αυτόνομο κράτος με το όνομα "Κρητική Πολιτεία", υπό τον Πρίγκιπα Γεώργιο ως Υπατο Αρμοστή. Η ένωσή της με την Ελλάδα αναγνωρίστηκε το 1913 με τη Συνθήκη του Λονδίνου μετά τους Βαλκανικούς Πολέμους του 1912-13.

Ο Αθηναίος φιλόσοφος Πλάτων (427-347 π.Χ.) ήταν ο επιφανέστερος μαθητής του Σωκράτη και εκείνος που κατ' εξοχήν διέσωσε τη διδασκαλία του με τη μορφή των Διαλόγων του. Το 387 π.Χ., επιστρέφοντας στην Αθήνα μετά το πρώτο του ταξίδι στην Ιταλία, ίδρυσε τη φιλοσοφική σχολή του, την Ακαδημία, στην περιοχή του σημερινού Κολωνού, όπου υπήρχε ιερό του ήρωος Ακαδήμου. Στη σχεδόν χιλιετή λειτουργία της. μέχρι το 529 μ.Χ., η Ακαδημία διατήρησε την ακτινοβολία της, διευρύνοντας και ανανεώνοντας τη διδασκαλία του ιδρυτή της. Οι ιδέες της μεταλαμπαδεύθηκαν στον αραβικό κόσμο και μέσω αυτού στη μεσαιωνική Ευρώπη. Η λέξη ακαδημία και τα παράγωγά της χρησιμοποιούνται σήμερα σε όλες σχεδόν τις γλώσσες για να δηλώσουν έννοιες όπως η υψηλής στάθμης παιδεία, η επιστημονική κοινότητα και το ανώτατο πνευματικό ίδρυμα.

## CONSTANTINE CAVAFY (1863-1933)

Constantine Cavafy is one of modern Greece's most important poets and perhaps the best known and most translated. He was born and lived in cosmopolitan Alexandria, then – like in Hellenistic times – a crossroads of cultures. He wrote relatively few and short poems, which he worked and reworked with minute care. He used austere means of expression and mostly free verse, far from the conventions of his time, with a deeply personal style and idiosyncratic language, between the scholarly *katharevousa* and the *demotic*. Distinctive features of his poetry are dramatic style, irony, sensuality and philosophical contemplation, often inspired by historical figures and events.

#### ΜΥΚΟΝΟΣ - ΔΗΛΟΣ

Η Μύχονος είναι από τα πρώτα ελληνικά νησιά που αναπτύχθηκαν τουριστικά. Ήδη από τη δεκαετία του 1960 άργισαν να συορέουν ολοένα περισσότεροι επισχέπτες και σήμερα η Μύκονος είναι το πο κοσμοπολίτικο νησί στην Ελλάδα, με τουριστική κίνηση ολόκλησο το χρόνο. Με το λιτό, άδενδρο και βραχώδες ανάγλυφο και την άριστα διατηρημένη παραδοσιακή αρχιτεπτονική, το "νησί των ανέμων" είναι ίσως το αντιπροσωπευτικότερο δείγμα κυκλαδικού τοπίου. Σε μικρή απόσταση από τη Μύχονο βρίσχεται η ιερή κατά την αρχαιότητα νήσος Δήλος, τόπος γέννησης του Απόλλωνος και της Αρτέμιδος, η οποία κηρύχθηκε το 1990 μνημείο παγκόσμιας πολιτιστικής κληρονομιάς από την UNESCO. Ακατοίκητο και απαλλαγμένο από κάθε αισθητική όχληση, το μικροσκοπικό κυκλαδονήσι διατηρεί σήμερα την ιερότητά του ως αρχαιολογικός χώρος με πλήθος ευρημάτων από την κλασική, ελληνιστική και ρωμαϊκή περίοδο.

## HIPPOCRATES (460-377 B.C.)

Hippocrates of Cos is regarded as the father of Western medicine for basing the art of healing on rational principles and liberating it from divine causality and superstition. He perceived man as a whole entity, and health as resulting from multiple factors, including environmental and dietary ones. The Hippocratic Corpus, a collection of works left by Hippocrates and his students, deals with practically all branches of medicine and systematically records clinical symptoms and treatments, always in line with the principle "to do good, or [at least] to do no harm". The Hippocratic Oath remains the guide to medical ethics and practice to this day.



## PYTHAGORAS (ca. 570-495 B.C.)

Pythagoras of Samos is perhaps the best known pre-Socratic philosopher and, as tradition has it, the first thinker to have called himself a "philosopher", i.e. a lover of knowledge. His philosophy was based on mathematics (he is credited with developing the Pythagorean theorem), postulating that numbers underlie the order of the universe (which he first termed cosmos, a word meaning "ornament") and that numerical relationships are inherent in music. Pythagoras and his students were the first to form an organised philosophical movement, initially based in Croton, Magna Graecia. The teachings of Pythagoras influenced mature Greek philosophy and were central to the thinking of Plato, the Academy and the Neoplatonists.



## SOPHOCLES (496-406 B.C.)

The second, chronologically, of the three great tragedians of classical Athens, Sophocles was the most popular of the three and the most awarded in dramatic festivals. He gave tragedy its final form, by adding a third actor (Aeschylus had added the second), and by introducing painted stage sets. He wrote over 120 tragedies, only seven of which have survived in complete form. The tragic in Sophocles stems from man's powerlessness in the face of the inscrutable will of the gods and fate. Oedipus, Antigone, Electra are some of his archetypal tragic figures who, despite their downfall, preserve their moral stature and dignity. Very pious, dedicated to his native city and having performed more than his fair share of civic and military duties, Sophocles was an accomplished personality and a model citizen of the classical age.



## THE ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITE OF TIRYNS

Tiryns is the second largest Mycenaean acropolis, after Mycenae, in the eastern Peloponnesian region of Argolis. The hill of Tiryns was first inhabited in the Neolithic age. The settlement grew and reached its apogee in the Mycenaean Age (1600-1200 B.C.), as evidenced by the cyclopean walls, the great ramp, the *megaron*, the galleries (probably serving as storerooms) and tunnels (leading to underground cisterns). Listed a UNESCO World Heritage Site together with Mycenae, Tiryns fascinates the visitor and evokes the heroes of Argolic myth, as well as the modern epopee of excavations, from H. Schliemann to our day.


